Code of Conduct

These rules are in place to ensure the enjoyment and safety of all Portsmouth Darts Academy (PDA) members.

<u>Students</u>

- Maintain proper Dart Etiquette at all times. See separate Dart Etiquette document.
- Students should not run whilst inside the academy venue or when attending any academy event or activity. Particularly when holding darts.
- Before a student throws their darts, the throwing area must be fully clear. It is up to the student to ensure accidents are avoided by waiting for any opponent or fellow student to be behind the oche.
- Students must remain in the academy room, with the exception of going to the toilet, whilst the academy session is underway. Students must not leave the building until the end of the session, and only once collected by their parent/guardian.
- Students must not push, pull or mess around with any other student whilst at the academy.
- Students must never threaten to or pretend to throw a dart at another member, parent/guardian, spectator, coach, or Academy official. This will result in immediate disciplinary action being carried out.
- The use of inappropriate language will not be tolerated.
- Unsociable behaviour will not be tolerated towards any student, coach or Academy official.
- The Academy supports a zero-tolerance approach to bullying, racism, sexism or homophobia. Any incident will result in immediate disciplinary action being carried out.

Parents/Guardians

- Encourage your child to read these rules, learn them and abide by them. Encourage good behaviour and discourage poor gamesmanship behaviours.
- Discourage unfair play and arguing with Academy officials
- Help your child to recognise good performance and not just the score.
- Never force your child to take part in darts (or any game).
- Set a good example, by recognising fair play and applauding the good performance of all.
- Never punish, shout at, or belittle a child for a loss, poor performance, or a mistake.
- Publicly accept an Official's decision/judgement, whether you agree or not.
- Support your child's involvement and encourage them to enjoy participation. As well as having fun, they are there to learn.
- Please ensure your child's fees and subscriptions are paid on time.
